implementation of own grant / research project financed from external sources (e.g. Diamond Grant, NCN grants)	5 points
implementation of own grant / research project financed from university funds (e.g. ID-UB)	4 points
co-author in a grant (named member of the grant holder's team)	4 points
co-contractor in a grant (contractor without specification of membership in the grant team)	2 points
MNiSW scholarship for learning achievements	3 points
1 <sup>st</sup> , 2 <sup>nd</sup> or 3 <sup>rd</sup> place in a national / university / faculty / institute competition for the best BA or MA thesis	3 points
honourable mention in a national / university / faculty / institute competition for the best BA or MA thesis	2 points
Rector's 1 <sup>st</sup> or 2 <sup>nd</sup> degree award for academic achievements	2 points
Rector's 3 <sup>rd</sup> degree award for academic achievements	1 point
work on a journal editorial board	2 points
paper presented at a scientific conference	2 points
conducting workshops, author's meeting, panel	1 point
<b>Other achievements (points awarded for maximum three documented achievements)<sup>2</sup></b>	<b>Max. 5 points in total</b>
completion of a post-graduate course / second master's studies (or final semester of studies in progress)	2 points
